



2. On May 9, 2006, at 10:30 p.m., I attended the roll call for my shift in the Detention Division.
3. During the roll call, a supervisor introduced two gentlemen that were described as being invited by Sheriff Clarke to the roll call. The two gentlemen introduced themselves as being from Elmbrook Church, and invited roll call attendees to an upcoming seminar at Elmbrook Church where Milwaukee Police Department Chief Hegerty would be speaking on how Christ affected her life and how we could affect others' live through Christ. The speakers stated that the seminar was non-denominational, and that all "faiths" were invited.
4. The speakers at that roll call also discussed the stressful nature of law enforcement, and how their church could provide support. They provided a flyer which, among other things, referenced "HOW YOU CAN IMPACT OTHERS FOR CHRIST," and "HOW CHRIST CAN IMPACT YOUR LIFE" (emphasis in original). *See Exhibit B to Felber Aff.*
5. I felt offended by the presentation. I raised my hand during the presentation and asked whether representatives from the Catholic Church would also be attending roll call. The supervisor told me we could talk after the presentation.
6. The day after the roll call, I called the Sheriff's Office to formally complain about the presentation. Captain Bailey called me at home in response to my complaint and stated that the roll call presentations would continue.
