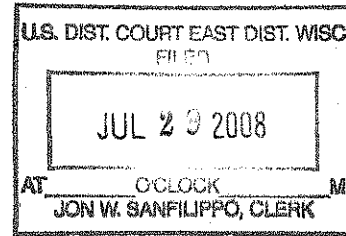

Dear Judge Randa:

I am writing to ask for release from extended supervision. On August 15th, it will be a year since it began.


My work as a consultant and in film making requires increasing travel across the U.S. and to other countries and U.S. territories. These trips are often at short notice and it is necessary to be free of the restrictions of the local USP Office, which is aware of this request. I would also ask for the return of my passport.

I have submitted in writing to my USPO a detailed report on the nature of the travel. I will submit to the Court, if requested. I have refrained to do so with this letter for privacy reasons and ask to be allowed to submit under seal, if so requested. The USPO is not opposed to this request.

At a minimum, I would ask to be released from the travel restrictions. However, I would ask the Court to recognize no need for further supervision at this one-year juncture. In addition, as I will be authorized to begin practicing law again upon the completion of the reapplication process, which I am now undertaking, my duty to clients, including the duty of confidentiality, may conflict with my responsibilities under extended supervision.

I am current on my restitution payments ordered by the Court. I will continue to meet my restitution responsibilities in any case and am aware the US-DOJ has the right to seek judgment, if necessary. Without the freedom to travel and earn income, the ability to meet the restitution and other financial obligations I have is extremely limited. Without increased income, it is difficult to fully respond to the requirements to be readmitted to the Bar.
